PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

To the Parents, Caregivers and Community Members of Seaforth State School, We Welcome You.

Welcome to Term 2 everyone! We hope you have all had a relaxing and safe holiday break and are ready for the term ahead. I know that personally I'm back into the swing of lunchboxes and morning routines. Just like Term 1, this term will be a busy one as a staff we are continuing to try and be as organised as possible. You should have already received emails from staff requesting parent/carers to make appointments for interviews in Weeks 2 and 3. We encourage all parents/carers to make appointments to discuss your child's learning after the first term of learning.

There are of course lots of other exciting events coming up. Our main event this term is our School's Athletics Carnival but there will also be other days and celebrations along the way. This includes ANZAC Day, Day for Dolly, Simultaneous Reading Day, Year 6 to 7 transition meetings (for Mackay North State High School), Mother's Day, an Instrumental Music Camp, School Photo Day and lots of other events in between. - subsidised or donated the cost entirely for the hire of buses to and from events for all students in grades P-6!
- Purchased new fridges for all students in all classrooms
- Purchased refrigerated water coolers for all students
- Co-ordinated and ran our Annual Rainbow Run event participated in by all students

And of course, I have to take this opportunity to briefly promote student attendance! Last term we reduced the percentage of students attending less than 85% of the time to approximately 15%! This is down from almost 26% in the first five weeks of the term—thank you everyone for your continued efforts. Our goal this term is to remain over 90% attendance! 

#### PBL NEWS - from Mrs Francis PBL Team Leader

**Welcome** - to our first PBL News for Term 2! I hope all of our families enjoyed the Easter break and you enjoyed lots of delicious chocolate to celebrate.



Week 1 saw each of the classes "Revise their classroom rules and expectations" to remind the students of what each teacher expects. The main focus of our classroom rules are as follows:

Having a go and doing their best at all times
Trying hard to listen and follow instructions
Raising hands to speak in class
Being kind to themselves and others
Keeping hands, feet and objects to themselves
Staying in their seats unless instructed otherwise



These basic rules help our classes to be focused and positive throughout each learning day and the expectations are the same for any teacher that is in the classroom. The students have created their classroom rules in consolidation with their classroom teachers as they believe these rules will help students to learn and teachers to teach.

Our Week 2 focus is, 'I will learn my class transition routines' which fits under our Be a Learner school rule.

There are essentially three types of transitions: Entering class and taking a seat, switching from one academic activity to another and exiting the classroom. *Over the fortnight, students will be learning to:* 

**Know the cues for transitions** 

Know their classes expectations for transitioning

Willingly accept these rules and do their best to transition the way they are expected to

Transition around the school in a quiet and orderly manner

This is because it is important to develop and reinforce classroom transition rules and norms to ensure a predictable, safe learning environment for all students. Successful transitions allow the class to function in a respectful, orderly way, that allows learning to continue promptly.

Some examples of transitions are: moving from carpet time to desk work, coming back into the classroom after lunch, attending or returning from a specialist lesson, going to another area of the school (e.g.: library, shade structure, school oval), rotating from one small group activity to another, walking down to the eating area and walking down with the class at the end of the school day.

#### Staff will be looking for students who are:

Actively trying to follow their class transition routines

Responding to their class cues or instructions to transition promptly

Following the instructions of the teacher for that particular transition

Transitioning around the school quietly

Transitioning around the school in a calm and orderly way



A PBL Meeting is held twice each term and **Angela Gifford is our PBL Parent Representative** who attends these meetings.
