#### **Students returning from Victoria**

With the escalation of H1N1 Influenza A (Human Swine Influenza) in Victoria, the Australian Government has expanded the seven-day time-out period for school students and children in early childhood education and care centres to include those coming to Queensland from Victoria.

The expansion of the seven-day time-out period to include Victoria is designed to help protect Queensland students against the spread of Human Swine Influenza. It means students returning from visits to Victoria will now face the same expectations for time-out as students arriving in Queensland from the United States of America, Canada, Panama and Japan, who are asked to observe a seven-day time-out before entering a Queensland school. It is important that schools and teachers are prepared to provide five days of work for any students in this situation to complete from home.
